Excellency,

With the Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention Meeting of Experts (24-28 August) now only one month away, I am writing once more in my capacity as Chair to update you on preparations for the meeting.

Schedule

Following my consultations, I have developed the attached indicative schedule, which shows the proposed allocation of time during the meeting, as well as the various lunchtime and morning seminars presented by a number of interested organizations. A formal programme of work, based on this indicative schedule, will be prepared for adoption by States Parties in the usual way. Again, I would like to remind delegations that we have a lot of material to cover in one week, and we will need to retain a degree of flexibility in our scheduling.

Poster session

Please note that the poster session will be held from 16:00-18:00 on Thursday 27 August, in the area outside Room XIX (where the Meeting of Experts is being held). Posters are welcome to be left up for the entire week. The title and a summary of posters, as well as an electronic copy where one exists, should be provided to the Implementation Support Unit (ISU) as soon as possible. The poster session will be an important opportunity for sharing information on both specific needs for, and capabilities to provide, capacity building in the area of disease surveillance, detection, diagnosis, and containment of infectious diseases. I encourage all delegations to participate.

Statements and presentations

To help ensure the smooth running of the meeting, I would be grateful if delegations could inform the ISU, as soon as possible, of any statements and presentations they plan to make during the meeting. I encourage delegations to contact the ISU to discuss the scheduling of contributions, as this will help us to group related contributions together, leading to a more coherent and rewarding

discussion. I would like to remind delegations of the limit of **five minutes** for national statements to the meeting, and **15 minutes** for technical presentations.
