It is my great honor to invite you to attend our upcoming Health Financing Symposium for Global Health and Noncommunicable Diseases (NCDs), 08:30 – 13:00 on 21 May 2019, at the Graduate Institute Geneva, Switzerland, during World Health Assembly Week.

The <u>Health Finance Institute</u> has over recent months provided support to the WHO Independent High-level Commission on NCDs in taking forward a recommendation in their 2018 report, *Time to Deliver;* 'The international community should consider the establishment of a multi-donor fund, to catalyze financing for the development of national NCDs and mental health responses and policy coherence at country level'.

The Political Declaration of the Third High-level Meeting included paragraphs on voluntary innovative financing mechanisms and the WHO Executive Board Paper /7 2019 also referred to voluntary innovative funding mechanisms, such as a multi-donor trust fund, building on ongoing relevant work.<sup>2</sup>

The Symposium offers a unique platform for participants to learn more about traditional and innovative financing for NCDs and discuss opportunities for establishing catalytic financing for countries to develop their response for NCDs.
