The purpose of the conference is aimed at defining the current role and future potential of technological, medical physics and molecular/biological innovations for their incorporation into routine clinical practice in radiation oncology.

The conference will be held in English.

It is very much appreciated that you have agreed to present a paper on 'Expanding radiotherapy access as part of the Cancer Control Action Plan in Georgia' in the symposium on "Radiotherapy in the context of national cancer control strategies".

The IAEA will provide you with a lump sum of €2230 for the travel expenses to and from Vienna and for living expenses, including incidentals, connected with the conference. You will be fully responsible for making your own travel arrangements and for cancellation costs if any. This amount has been calculated on the assumption that you will stay for the total duration of the conference. Should this not be the case, you would be requested to reimburse the IAEA for the appropriate difference.

It is understood that your travel and living expenses are not covered fully from any other source.

It should be noted that compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of personal property. The IAEA also does not provide health insurance coverage for participants in meetings, workshops or training courses or for consultants. Arrangements for private insurance coverage on an individual basis should therefore be made. The IAEA will, however, provide insurance coverage for accidents and illnesses that clearly result from any work performed for the IAEA.
