High-level meeting on Health systems for prosperity and solidarity: leaving no one behind Tallinn, Estonia, 13–14 June 2018

On behalf of the WHO Regional Office for Europe, it is my honour to invite you to the high-level meeting on *Health systems for prosperity and solidarity: leaving no one behind*, which will be hosted by the Ministry of Social Affairs of Estonia in Tallinn on 13–14 June 2018.

The meeting will mark the 10th anniversary of the Tallinn Charter on Health Systems for Health and Wealth reconfirming its founding values (http://www.euro.who.int/en/media-centre/events/2008/06/who-european-ministerial-conference-on-health-systems). It will also serve as an opportunity to:

- celebrate the achievements of the Tallinn;
- share innovations and recent good practices from across the WHO European Region;
- outline policy directions for 21st century health systems that are person-centred, resilient and equitable, in line with the Sustainable Development Goals and Health 2020.

The technical programme will offer a platform to senior health policy decision-makers and stakeholders, including ministers of health and representatives of key regional partners, to debate three overarching themes: Include, Invest and Innovate.

- **Include** will advocate for improved coverage, access and financial protection for everyone. It will draw attention to systematic inequalities in financial protection and showcase experiences of countries in the European Region in securing access to services and financial protection.
- **Invest** will make the case for investing in health systems with measurable returns for the population's health and for prosperity. It will call for improved dialogue between decision makers from the spheres of health and finance to optimize investments to achieve better health outcomes.
