## WHO European Childhood Obesity Surveillance Initiative

The WHO Regional Office for Europe has established the Childhood Obesity Surveillance Initiative (COSI) in thirty-nine Member States of the WHO European Region. The system routinely measures trends in overweight and obesity in primary-school children (aged 6-9 years), in order to monitor the progress of the problem in this population group across countries of the WHO European Region.

COSI was initiated as a response to the 2006 European Ministerial Conference on Counteracting Obesity in Istanbul, Turkey. It has since been expanded several times and is highlighted as a key risk factor surveillance tool in the Action Plan for the Prevention and Control of Noncommunicable Diseases 2016–2025 and the European Food and Nutrition Action Plan 2015-2020.

COSI is used as a data source for reporting on progress within and between countries, as well as benchmarking against international commitments to address NCDs and child nutrition and physical activity. COSI is unique as it provides a large dataset with at least 250 000 children in the Region, and is based on nationally representative samples and standardized weight and height measurements. The children are being measured and surveyed based on a common protocol and approach. A first data collection took place during the school year 2007/2008, the second round during the school year 2009/2010, the third round during the school year 2012/2013 and the fourth round is taking place before the end of 2017.

The anthropometric results of the COSI data collection rounds are published in national and intercountry reports as well as scientific journals.

I would like to investigate with you the possibility of Georgia to participate in the 4th round of COSI data collection, which is planned by the end of 2017.
