The very comprehensive program allowed the delegation to witness firsthand the impact of the programs supported by the Global Fund over the years, the tremendous progress Georgia has achieved against HIV, TB and MDR-TB after successfully eliminating malaria, the innovations being introduced, the increased support to key populations, as well as the tremendous strides towards Universal Health Coverage. The delegation was also impressed by Georgia's leadership in increasing domestic resources for health to gradually take over costs and make programs sustainable in the long run.

The visit was essential for members of the German parliament economic cooperation and development committee. They approve Germany's yearly contributions to the Global Fund, which is critical to honor funding requests under the current allocation, and they can discuss policy matters with German representatives on the Global Fund Board and Strategy Committee. The visit was also helpful for civil society representatives to deepen their understanding of program successes and challenges in order to strengthen their advocacy efforts for the region.

We look forward to continuing the strong collaboration with Georgia.
