New Knowledge and Skills for 247 Social Workers from All Over the Country



On December 7th USAID's Mission Director Douglass Ball together with the Deputy Minister of Labor health and Social Affairs Valeri Kvartskhelia and the Director of the State Fund for the Protection and Assistance of (Statutory) Victims of Human Trafficking, Tamuna Barkalaia, hosted the certificate handling ceremony for the social workers, to celebrate the completion of the

complex multi-module training program they underwent during the year. With the support of the USAID's Reduction of Domestic Violence in Georgia Project, implemented by the State Fund, 247 social workers have been trained, and now they are able to provide better, prompter and more efficient service to the victims of domestic violence.

The multi-module training program, aimed at improving social workers performance, was launched September 19th and covered the topics like forms and consequences of the DV, bio-psycho-social assessment of the victims and intervention mechanisms and technics.
