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FOREWORD

Georgia is a highly disaster-prone country, which frequently experiences natural hazards (e.g. earthquakes, floods, landslides, mudflows, avalanches, and drought) as well as man-made emergencies (e.g. industrial accidents and traffic accidents). Compounding factors such as demographic change, unplanned urbanization, poorly maintained infrastructure, lax enforcement of safety standards, socio-economic inequities, epidemics, environmental degradation and climate variability amplify the frequency and intensity of disasters and call for a proactive and multi-hazard approach.

Disaster risk reduction is a cross-cutting and complex development issue. It requires political and legal commitment, public understanding, scientific knowledge, careful development planning, responsible enforcement of policies and legislation, people-centred early warning systems, and effective disaster preparedness and response mechanisms. Close collaboration of policy-makers, scientists, urban planners, engineers, architects, development workers and civil society representatives is a precondition for adopting a comprehensive approach and inventing adequate solutions. Multi-stakeholder and inter-agency platforms can help provide and mobilize knowledge, skills and resources required for mainstreaming disaster risk reduction into development policies, for coordination of planning and programmes, and for provision of analysis and advice. For this reason, UNDP established a Disaster Risk Reduction Think-Tank in Georgia in March of 2009 in close collaboration with the Georgian National Committee for Disaster Risk Reduction and Environmental Sustainable Development (formed in 2008).

Since disaster risk reduction requires new collaboration patterns among a wide group of participants, one of the first joint initiatives was to obtain an overview of who does what and where in the field of disaster risk reduction in Georgia. This 3W-exercise was launched at the first Disaster Risk Reduction Think-Tank meeting in March of 2009. Based upon templates from the inter-agency Emergency Health and Nutrition Working Group in Nepal, forms were developed, translated and disseminated to various agencies / institutions involved in disaster risk reduction. Initial results were presented at the third Think-Tank meeting in July 2009 along with guidelines on how to fill in the questionnaire. The second edition was elaborated during the first three months of 2010. Although this second edition remains a working document, we hope the 47 institutional / organizational profiles will facilitate better coordination among stakeholders in Georgia involved in disaster risk reduction.

This publication is based on information received from partner agencies / organizations and requires continuous review and updating in order to provide an accurate picture of the disaster risk reduction scenario in Georgia. It is important that partners provide regular updates to their profiles in order to keep the publication current. The UK Government is running a small project on crisis management with the Georgian Government, funded through the Conflict Prevention Pool. The project aims to improve crisis management at the strategic level and to strengthen cross-government co-operation, through sharing UK experience, expertise and best practice. In 2008/9, the project funded a number of inward and outward visits to share expertise in, inter alia, central management of crises, risk analysis methodology, and analytical techniques. In 2009/10 we have shared expertise in regional responses to crises and will provide training in analytical skills as well as a crisis management simulation exercise. We will also provide experts to advise the Georgian Government in areas of specific need, such as setting up and running a central crisis management centre.

FAO has offered support to the region. FAO reacted rapidly to the August 2008 conflict, working with the Government and international partners to conduct a comprehensive agricultural sector needs assessment, and contribute to the Consolidated Appeal Process. In this framework FAO has provided emergency agricultural inputs to vulnerable conflict affected population in Shida Kartli – animal feed and vegetables seeds and associated inputs.		The main objective is restoration of agricultural production capacity and food security to pre-conflict levels. Although the emergency phase is now over, not enough funds were provided to reboot agricultural activities, and most recovery activities have yet to begin (pending funding). Without this support, the food security emergency phase will be protracted well into 2010. In June 2009 FAO has assessed hydrogeological and irrigation situation in conflict affected areas. Assessment findings indicate that farming community resilience to the lack of irrigation water can be enhanced through proper technical solutions. FAO also carries out country wide surveillance and diagnostics to control the risk of Transboundary animal diseases to prepare for and possibly prevent outbreaks. Beginning from August 2009 FAO plans implementation of activities aimed at restoration and improvement of agricultural based livelihoods in selected most vulnerable IDP settlements and returnee villages in the AASO through the recovery and establishment of agricultural activities and provision of solutions for improved irrigation sources.

In the cross-cutting area of migration, climate change and environmental degradation, IOM addresses linkages between the environment and climate change on the one hand, and human settlement and population movement on the other from a human mobility perspective. Disaster Risk Reduction activities have become an essential part of the stabilization and prevention process, in which IOM works together with governments and communities in order to build resilience to hazards. IOM's strategic interventions are grounded on the understanding that community involvement, including the use of local human resources and materials, is essential in order to stimulate local ownership and safeguard the long-term sustainability. In Georgia, IOM initiated a programme "Enhancement of Network Capacities between NGOs in the Field of Emergency Management" in 2002. In 2002 – 2003, IOM organized a series of trainings for NGOs in Emergency Management & Disaster Preparedness. Also, IOM provided inputs for the legislative review process on insurance and damages caused by natural disasters. Currently IOM Georgia is looking at the possibilities to develop projects and interventions to accommodate certain disaster risk management and disaster risk reduction needs in Georgia.

In September 2009, Caucasus Environmental NGO Network (CENN) began implementing: Strengthening Local Capacity and Developing Structured Dialogue for Climate Change Adaptation, Natural Disaster Risk Reduction and Post-Conflict Environmental Rehabilitation project. The objective of the project is to develop flexible and resilient rural communities that are capable of coping with the impacts of climate variability. The organization has a total of about 150 professional staff members in the region; working with the required expertise on community mobilization, agriculture, marketing, legal issues, animal husbandry, socio-economical issues, database management, engineering, administration, logistics, support and project management. ACF South Caucasus is implementing programmes focused on economic development, income generating activities, community development, food security, WASH, and the Markets for The Poor approach.		At the moment, ACF in South Caucasus does not have any direct programmes on DRR. However, this is considered as a cross-cutting issue in all on-going programs and projects of the organization. Project design includes minimising negative environmental impact and ensuring long-term sustainability. The organisation is currently implementing a surveillance survey programme in Armenia and Azerbaijan; the results of which will ultimately be used as a predictive tool for natural disaster coordination preparedness and response management planning. This information will be presented as a vulnerability index in GIS; based on inputs of socio-economic factors to map the geographical concentration of human vulnerability risks. Input from local municipalities is critical to achieve effective sustainability. A DRR researcher has been recruited to identify areas for intervention in the South Caucasus and to train all bases on mainstreaming the issue. It has to be mentioned that, as an institution, ACF is very active in the field of DRR in many other missions.

Because of the earth's crust and block structure of lithosphere, earthquake focuses are related to the block borders. In order to identify and specify them, a geology-structural foundation of mapping of seismic zoning was created. After the implemented seismic zoning, a set of ZSD-99 maps was produced for the territory of Georgia. They show the levels of calculated seismic effects (intensity, PGA), for the given P probability of excess and the fixed T time interval, i.e. during this time interval it is possible to occur at least one earthquake, the effect of which will exceed the calculated one. According to the produced results, conditions for using each ZSD-00 map were regulated. Namely, they are intended for anti-seismic measures for constructing the sites with three terms: a. Map 5% probability: for ancillary buildings for non-residential purposes. b. Map 2% probability: for main constructions. c. Map 1% probability: for selecting the sites for constructing significant buildings, for conducting future detailed and micro seismic zoning there. Obviously, the maps mentioned above represent a long-term earthquake forecasting maps, but it is necessary to have them not only for ensuring seismic-stable construction, but also for micro-seismic zoning of large cities and for conducting further detailed researches with the purpose of identifying the earthquake prerequisites.
