Thanking you again for your kind offer for assistance on the occasion of the joint meeting between His Excellency the Minister of Labour, Health and Social Affairs, Mr. Sergeenko, you and the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany to Georgia on February 28, 2018, I herewith kindly request your assistance in obtaining information regarding the following medical questions:

1. Case summary

The patient in question is a Georgian national currently residing in Germany and suffering from **pain**. Because of his condition, he is currently receiving medical treatment with morphine.

- 2. Questions regarding therapy and treatment
- a) Could the patient continue his treatment with morphine in Georgia?
- b) What are the possible requirements so that he may receive morphine treatment?
- c) Is the morphine-containing drug "M-Stada 30mg" registered and available in Georgia?
- d) If morphine is not available in Georgia: Are other opiate drugs registered and available in order to continue his medication and treatment?

- e) Are the following medications registered and available in Georgia:
 - a. Amitriptylin 25mg
 - b. Keltican forte
 - c. Pantoprazol 20mg
 - d. Ibuprofen 600mg
 - e. Gabapentin 300mg
